- Talk about stories they have heard discussing what has happened and making predictions
- Visit Seven Stories to build on their knowledge of stories
- Apply phonic knowledge to write for a purpose throughout classroom areas



Physical Development

- Hold a pencil using the correct grip and begin to form recognisable letters

Understanding the World

- Complete a simple program on an iPad
- Talk about special events from home Tapestry
- Begin to understand cultural celebrations Diwali,

SMSC

- Social begin to understand democracy through voting for the daily story
- Cultural understanding the differences and similarities between cultures celebrated within the class

Communication and Language

- Learning and reciting poetry and rhyme
- Develop confidence when talking as part of a small group – Plan, Do, Review
- Increase vocabulary through role play, storytelling, small world play
- Increase our listening skills and understand 'who' and 'why' questions
- Follow two part instructions

Expressive Arts and Design

- Colour mixing
- Explore mark making with different textures/materials
- Find different ways to join materials, adapting and improving work
- Explore the different sounds of instruments and how sounds can be changed
- Sing a range of familiar songs and rhymes and begin to learn new ones
- Introduce a storyline into their play

Mathematics

- Recognise numbers to 10 in and out of sequence
- Count forwards and backwards using numbers to 10
- Place quantities in order and explain reasoning
- Find the total number of objects in a group by adding them together
- Say the number that is 1 more and 1 less than a given number – to 5 then to 10
- Begin to understand addition and subtraction through practical activities
- Begin to recognise and describe 2D shapes using mathematical language
- Create and recreate patterns and build models
- Use everyday language related to money
