Key Stage 2 MFL Statutory Coverage

Pupils should be taught to:

1. Listen and engage
2. Ask and answer questions
3. Speak in sentences using familiar vocabulary
4. Develop appropriate pronunciation
5. Show understanding of words and phrases
6. Write phrases from memory
7. Understand basic grammar
8. Appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes
9. Broaden vocabulary

Key Objective	Key Skills
1. Speaking and Listening	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Begin to understand and use simple grammatical features – e.g. tense. - Memorise key words and phrases from books, building vocabulary. - Draw on background understanding of vocabulary and grammar when listening. - Use language in drama and role play, and experiment with new vocabulary. - Speak audibly with increasing fluency. - Demonstrate understanding through verbalisation, linking new meanings to known vocabulary. - Use increasingly correct vocabulary and terminology. - Listen and respond to each other and to adults. - Tell the time in more complex terms. - Ask questions to extend understanding. - Explain ideas and concepts, showing understanding and comprehension.
2. Reading and Writing	-Read about a given topic, with simple interpretations.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Retrieve and record information.- Paraphrase and summarise information in the new language.- Write explanations and concepts.- Summarise information in their own writing.- Apply new phrases from reading to previous vocabulary and grammar.
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
